What: California's largest, oldest vinifera vines to be pruned by advanced viticulture students

Where: Mark West Springs Road, Santa Rosa, California

Santa Rosa, CA: Currently, there is no knowledge of any grapevines in North America as large and as old as the vines at HUMMINGBIRD GARDENS at Mark West Lodge. The base of the largest of the seven giant vines is over five feet in circumference. The cordons span the entire two lane roadway, a distance of over forty feet. Dr. Stephen J. Krebs, Program Coordinator of Viticulture and Winery Technology at Napa Valley College, and Daniel Robledo, Viticulture Program Coordinator at Santa Rosa Junior College, have recruited an enthusiastic group of advanced viticulture students to prune these historic vines for the first time in over a decade. Students of these programs have gone on to become vineyard managers for some of the most prestigious vineyards in California. Valuing this symbol of America's great viticultural heritage, Krebs and Robledo will direct this sensitive pruning project to give these historic vines new health and vitality.

Dave Robertson, Deputy Director of Sonoma County Department of Transportation and Public Works also sees the value of pruning the vines from a traffic safety standpoint. While the County provides one way traffic control on the busy road, the pruners will use specialized lift equipment to reach the vines that tower more than twenty feet above the roadway. HUMMINGBIRD GARDENS Proprietor Jack Martin has also recruited certified arborist Joe Branum of Joe Branum Tree Care in Calistoga, California. Branum will be on site to provide additional expertise, manpower, and equipment. Proud custodian of these historic vines, Martin is very excited to provide this long awaited care.

The giant vines have been featured in Ripley's Believe-It-Or-Not. It is believed that they were originally planted in the 1840's when the facility was a stage-coach stop for carriages coming and going from San Francisco, and the road leading to it was only a dirt path. The vines had already spanned Mark West Springs Road by the late 1800's, when the arbor was touted as the largest in the world. Modern life and traffic continued to pass under the historic structure while the vines ran wild for over a century and a half.

According to Jack Martin, "We've completely reinvented the Northern California event facility Mark West Lodge (now known as HUMMINGBIRD GARDENS). Now we need to do justice to these majestic, old vines that have been here since the beginning of California's wine industry. They've survived against insurmountable odds, including phylloxera in the late 1800s and Mark West Lodge's historic fire of 1979. Finally, they'll be getting the attention they deserve and will refresh the roadway, while providing a brief moment of enjoyment as people continue to pass under this historic archway."
